

Reacting Stay up to date

Christmas and New Year's in Australia and Japan

Everyone in Japan and the Northern Hemisphere is probably familiar with the whole image of a White Christmas and Santa Claus handing out presents on his reindeer-led sleigh over the snow. But down in Australia where the season is opposite, the white in White Christmas stands for white sandy beaches not snow; and Santa rides waves on a surfboard.

Of course there are some other differences in the way Christmas is celebrated in Japan and Australia. Christmas in Japan is typically a time for hanging out with friends or going on a date with your partner. On the other hand most Australians typically celebrate Christmas with their extended families – often outside enjoying a barbeque.

This seems to be the reverse case in New Year's where it is often a time spent with family in Japan whilst it is more like a mid-summer festival in Australia with fireworks and parties to welcome in the New Year.

Incidentally Christmas Day is not a public holiday in Japan but it is in Australia. The day after Christmas is also a public holiday known as Boxing Day. Originally this day was a time when people would donate or leave presents and gifts for the poor, but is now more commonly known as a massive day of shopping with huge crowds in some major shopping centres. New Year's Day is a public holiday in both Japan and Australia.



Writing Japanese New Year's Cards (Nengajou)

There are a few things you need to be careful of when writing New Year's cards. For instance you can't write as a Japanese New Year's greeting, 新年あけましておめでとうございます (*Shinnen akemashite Omedetou gozaimasu*) as the words 新年 (*Shinnen*) and あけまして (*Akemashite*) both mean New Year so they overlap each other. You can write either 新年おめでとうございます (*Shinnen Omedetou gozaimasu*) or あけましておめでとうございます (*Akemashite Omedetou gozaimasu*) which both mean "Happy New Year".

Also you can't use the greetings 迎春 (*Geishun,* meaning "We welcome in the New Year") and 賀正 (*Gashou,* meaning "We celebrate the New Year") to people higher in rank than yourself as they can be considered impolite or disrespectful.

You write the date in the following ways:

- 1. You can write the Japanese year Heisei (name of the current Japanese era) followed by 元旦 (*Gantan*), New Year's Day e.g. 「平成〇〇年 元旦」
- 2. You can write the Japanese year as before but put 一月一日 (*Ichigatsu Tsuitachi*) meaning 1/1 or the 1st of January e.g. 「平成○○年 一月一日」
- 3. You can just write the year according to the Western calendar followed by 年 (*Nen*) and then 元旦 e.g. 「〇〇〇〇年 元旦」

If you send a New Year's card in time to have it arrive by New Year's Day, it will show even more consideration towards the person you sent it to. Although nowadays more people are sending New Year's messages through social networking services, it is still worth sending a New Year's card to people who are important to you such as close friends and family. It is best to post your New Year's cards by Christmas (25th December) so they can arrive in time for New Year's Day. So now's the time to prepare some *Nengajou* New Year's cards!
