Yumoto Onsen Shrine Festival

During the Golden Week period from the 3rd to the 5th of May, there were many omikoshi or portable shrine festivals around Iwaki, including festivals in Yotsukura, Onahama and Yumoto.

One of those omikoshi festivals was held in Yumoto on the 3rd of May as part of the annual Yumoto Onsen Festival. There were three omikoshi at this festival: an omikoshi carried by the men, a smaller one carried by the women and a large one which was carried around on a truck. Starting at Onsen Shrine, the portable shrines were carried along the main streets of Yumoto towards the station, stopping by several local Ryokan (Traditional Japanese Inn) along the way. People would often line the street, throwing coins wrapped in tissue into the shrine.

This was the first time I carried an omikoshi and so my arms were quite worn out at the end of the festival. But it was worth the effort in order to experience this type of Japanese festival and for the free trip to the local hot springs afterwards.

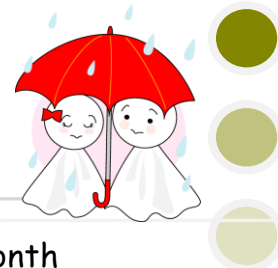

Your guide to what's happening around Iwaki City and beyond this month

Iwaki

4th-6th June: Katsuo Festival @ Iwaki La La Mew. From 9am. Over three days, there will be special bargain sales of in-season katsuo (bonito) on top of special raffles, taste testing and other events. On the second day, free katsuo (bonito) soup will be given out from 11am at the west side plaza for the first 500 arrivals. 5th June: Kugatachi Shinji @ Kotohira Shrine, Yumoto. Water will be boiled in a large cauldron at this Shinto ritual. The priest stirs the water with bamboo grass and splashes it on the surrounding area. It is believed that if you are splashed with the water you will be protected from misfortune. 5th June: Iwaki Rugby Festival @ Iwaki Green Field, Joban. From 1-5pm. Applications for runners in the 1000km Relay to Tokyo now open

From Aomori to Tokyo, this relay for cyclists and runners travels through areas that were affected by the Great East Japan Earthquake. The following information details the Iwaki leg of the relay.

Application Details

General-participation runners

3 August (Wed): Kaiseizan Athletics Track Field to Aquamarine Park (Onahama Port); 30 participants.

4 August (Thu): Aquamarine Park to Oarai Town Office; 40 participants.

- Participants run in groups of several people over 1-10km legs before handing over the sash to the next leg of runners.
- The desirable running distances are approximately 1km for primary school students, 3km for junior high school students and 5km for high school students and older.

Fureai runners (open for anyone including small children, families etc.)

4 August (Thu): Aquamarine Park (approximately 1.8km); 50 runners.

- *Fureai* runners will run or travel by wheelchair alongside guest runners.

- Note that you cannot enter as both a general-participation runner and a cyclist on the same day of the event.

The 2016 WBSC U-15 Baseball World Cup is coming to Iwaki

Iwaki City will host The 3rd WBSC U-15 Baseball World Cup, which is an under-15 global baseball tournament, from Friday, the 29th of July to the 7th of August. The tournament is organised by the World Softball Baseball Confederation (WBSC) and will be Iwaki's first time hosting an international sporting event.

The 12 national teams, including the 11 nations and territories that advanced through their respective continental qualifiers in addition to the host nation Japan, will compete in exciting matches as they vie for the title of world champion.

Date: 29 July (Fri) to 7 August (Sun)

Venue: Iwaki Green Stadium, Taira Baseball Stadium, Nambu Stadium

Iwaki City will support the event and reveal to the rest of the nation and world a revitalised city. And by creating an opportunity for the children to be exposed to sport, Iwaki City also aims to improve its competitive ability and increase the number of its professional athletes.

"One School: One Country" intercultural understanding program

To coincide with the tournament, 12 local junior high schools are conducting a "One School: One Country" program. Each school decides on the country or territory that they will support and learns about the local culture and language of that team. The program aims to further intercultural understanding and help develop a global outlook among the students.

The students will also get to meet with the children of the participating nations and show them their hospitality and support for the game – creating an exciting atmosphere for the tournament.

Mascot and Bus Wrapping

To further promote the tournament, Iwaki has unveiled a bus with the baseball tournament logo wrapped around it as well as the U-15 WBSC Baseball World Cup Iwaki Mascot "Hula Tamami". Keep your eyes peeled for the bus and Hula Tamami around Iwaki over the next few months!
