New Iwaki-Shinjuku highway bus service

As mentioned in the previous edition of Time Out, there is a now a direct bus route from Iwaki to Shinjuku stations. There are three daily bus services to Shinjuku in the morning, stopping at Oji and Ikebukuro Stations along the way. For the return trip, there are three daily bus services in the afternoon and evening. Note that the return trip does not stop at Ikebukuro Station. Both directions also include two rest stops along the way.

You can reserve a highway bus seat up to one month before the day of departure. Reservations can be done online through Japan Expressway Bus Net (<u>https://www.kousokubus.net/JpnBus/en</u> or <u>http://www.kousokubus.net/k</u> for mobile devices), or over the phone (TEL: 0246-46-0222). You can purchase reserved tickets at convenience stores or directly over the counter at the relevant bus terminal.

Information on the Family Support Centre Project for those who would like to balance work and childcare

Iwaki City has initiated the Family Support Centre Project. This facility aims to support mutual childrearing for those who are seeking help in childcare (requesting members), those who'd like to help others (assisting members) and those who'd like to both take care of others' children and have their own children looked after at other times (requesting and assisting members).

You can use the centre whenever you require someone to look after your child or pick them up outside of school and childcare facility hours, or if you require someone to look after your child under sudden or special circumstances such as when your child suddenly becomes slightly ill.

Membership is required and various conditions also apply when using the service. Please inquire for more details.

From the Editor

Summer is now just around the corner. Although it's only June, you've probably already found yourself rushing to turn on the air conditioner in your office or home the minute you walk inside. Or if you're able to get around by car, you'll probably be spending your weekends driving along the coast to catch the sea breeze through the window or up to the mountains to enjoy some cooler air. I should soon be able to enjoy summer this way too after I successfully completed driving school in just two months.

For those who are considering getting a Japanese driver's licence, there are other options apart from going to a driving school. For instance, if you are a confident driver, you can choose to take the driving and written tests directly at the driver's licence centre in Fukushima City. Those who decide to prepare for test through self-study can save enrolling in a very expensive school; but keep in mind that the test can be a lot harder to pass this way and may require multiple attempts. You can only take the test during weekdays which might require taking time off from work or study.

Another way to get your licence in Japan is by converting your home country licence. In order to convert your licence, you must have obtained it in your country at least 3 months before coming to Japan. You will also need your embassy to make an official Japanese translation of your licence and prepare a number of other documents.

Whichever method you take in obtaining your licence, make sure you give yourself plenty of time to study and learn the tricks to passing both the driving and written tests as even Japanese people often fail at these tests. You're bound to hit a few speed bumps along the way to getting your Japanese licence, but try to get through them at your own pace and look forward to the day you can cruise around this massive city.

That's why it is useful to remember these basic words and phrases when you need to know where to go and how to get there.
