Therry Blossom Viewing in Iwaki

Japan is famous for its beautiful cherry blossom season, which usually begins in the milder southern regions before gradually heading up to the northern regions later in April – otherwise known as a "cherry blossom front" or *sakura zensen* in Japanese.

The cherry blossoms generally start blooming in Iwaki before the rest of Fukushima Prefecture. However the cherry blossoms had begun blooming even earlier than usual this year due to the relatively warmer weather Iwaki had been receiving earlier this year.

The first cherry blossom flowers began blooming in Iwaki around the end of March before reaching full-bloom (*mankai*) in early-April. I had the chance to see some beautiful cherry blossom sights during this period. One of the easiest places to see cherry blossoms is perhaps the Shinkawa River which neighbours Iwaki City Hall. There are also some cherry blossom trees around Central Taira Park just in front of Alios.

But perhaps one of the most spectacular places to view cherry blossoms is Matsugaoka Park, which is about a 15 minute walk west of Iwaki Station. There were large crowds of people at the park with high school students and families enjoying picnics or the scenery underneath the pink and white coloured trees. There were also some stalls lined along the park which helped create a very festive atmosphere.

Unfortunately the cherry blossom season in Iwaki is over. If you didn't have the chance to see the wonderful mid-spring scenery, please take the time to view some of the Iwaki cherry blossoms next year!

Your guide to what's happening around Iwaki City and beyond this month

- **29th April-5th May: Special Night Viewing of Shiramizu Amidado** @ Shiramizu Amidado, Uchigo. For a limited time only, see inside the Shiramizu Amidado Temple, national treasure of Iwaki, at night and view the Buddhist statues illuminated in gold whilst listening to the chief priest's sermons. Entry into the temple grounds is ¥500 for adults and ¥300 for children. For inquiries, please contact the Shiramizu Amidado temple: TEL 0246-26-7008.
- **2nd-3rd May: Onahama Suwa Shrine Festival** @ Onahama Suwa Shrine and Iwaki La La Mew. This festival involves several types of Omikoshi (portable shrines) including a giant 2 tonne Omikoshi and a children's Omikoshi which you can also see at La La Mew in Onahama Port. - **3rd-4th May: Kashima Shrine Spring Festival** @ Kashima Shrine and Onahama Bishoku Hotel, Onahama. This annual Omikoshi festival also features a giant 2 tonne Taiko drum 2.7m in diameter which you can also see at the Onahama Bishoku Hotel. - **3rd-4th May: Okunitama Shrine Festival** @ Okunitama Shrine, Taira. Features traditional Yamatomai and Chigomai dances on the first day followed by a carrying of an Omikoshi around the town on the second day. For inquiries, please contact Okunitama shrine: TEL 0246-34-0092.
- **4th May: Yotsukura Suwa Shrine Festival** @ Yotsukura Suwa Shrine and various other places in Yotsukura. Several groups carrying Omikoshi will carry the shrines around Yotsukura in prayer for large fishing catches as well as maritime and household safety. - **5**th **May: Yosakoi Festival** @ south side plaza of Iwaki La La Mew. From 11:30am and again from 2pm. For inquiries, please visit the event page on Iwaki La La Mew's website: http://www.lalamew.jp/index.php?module=View&action=EventMore&EID=642.
- **8th May: Alios Park Festival** @ Taira Central Park (in front of Alios). From 11am-4pm. The festival is held every second Sunday on every month from April to November. There will be stalls selling food and drinks, works of art and handicrafts. There is a live stage with various performances by local DJs and dance groups. - **29th May: Walk Through Fukushima's Hundred Sights of Greenery** @ Tenjoda Park next to Mimaya Primary School, Uchigo. From 9.30am (applications on the day from 8.30am). Enjoy one of two scenic walking courses: a 10km course around Shiramizu Amidado Temple, and a 12km course which also includes some of Iwaki's coalmining heritage sites.
