<u>Cherry Blossom Festival and International Exchange at</u> <u>Iwaki Taira Castle Ruins</u>

The month of April is a very special time of year in Japan. It is the start of both the fiscal and academic year and also famous for the cherry blossom season. Iwaki Taira Castle Ruins, located a short but hilly walk away from the northern exit of Iwaki Station, held a Cherry Blossom Festival on 8 April so patrons could enjoy various activities and events whilst viewing the beautiful trees. The festival had a nostalgic feel to it, with craftwork, games and a *dagashiya* stand. A *dagashiya* is an old-type of confectionary store in Japan that sells cheap snacks and sweets for children.

Alongside the festival, Thai students who came to Iwaki for a Japanese language training program hosted by Higashi Nippon International University had the opportunity to experience a Japanese-style tea ceremony and join in the festival. They also performed several traditional Thai-style dances on an out-door stage and enjoyed some delicious spicy Thai curry and desert made by Iwaki's Thai community.

Whilst the cherry blossom season is unfortunately over for this year, Iwaki Taira Castle Ruins will be holding various other events throughout the year. So why not take some time to view this piece of Iwaki history right in the heart of the city!

JR Joban Line: Reopening of Namie Station and Replacement Bus Service from Tatsuta to Namie/Haranomachi

Six years after the Great East Japan Earthquake, trains are finally taking passengers to the newly reopened Namie Station on the JR Joban Line. Before the station reopened on 1 April 2017, this section of the Joban Line was closed as it was within the exclusion zone of the Fukushima Daiichi Nuclear Plant. With this reopening, you can now travel from Namie all the way to Sendai. For the remaining section of the Joban Line within the exclusion zone, a bus service is available from Tatsuta to Haranomachi, which stops at Tomioka, Namie and Odaka.

Tomioka Station is expected to reopen in October later this year and the entire Joban Line is expected to be reconnected by the end of 2019. There are 11 bus services for both directions between Tomioka and Tatsuta and a morning and evening bus service for both directions between Tatsuta and Namie. Preparing for the JLPT

Have you applied for the upcoming Japanese-Language Proficiency Test this July? Some readers might be attempting the test for the first time, whilst others might have passed a previous test and are taking on a higher level this time.

There are many useful resources for studying in preparation for the test. You can find a large selection of textbooks at most bookshops. Some of these textbooks are a comprehensive resource for the entire test, other textbooks only cover kanji, vocabulary, grammar, reading or listening sections. Some books are solely based on mock and previous exam questions. Some people may find it better to focus in detail on one or several aspects of the test whilst others might prefer studying over a broad range.

The IIA also has JLPT study recourses available for loan. Just visit the IIA (located on the 5th floor of Iwaki City Hall) and confirm if the textbook for your level is available.

Of course one other highly accessible resource is the internet. There are loads of sites which contain entire kanji and vocabulary lists, quizzes and practice exams. Here are just a few which you might find useful:
