Trial Run of electric-powered transport in Onahama

To coincide with the 10th International Aquarium Congress, a trial run of electric-powered transport known as Green Slow Mobility will be operating around the Onahama Port area. It will provide a free low-speed shuttle service stopping at Iwaki La La Mew, Aquamarine Park, Aquamarine Fukushima, AEON Mall, the Old Onahama Fish Markets and some services to Misaki Park.

Although reservation isn't required to ride, the transport is limited to only 9 passengers at a time.
