Cancellation of Annual Summer Festivals and Events

The year 2020 has seen many events cancelled or delayed due to the coronavirus pandemic. Although the situation has greatly improved in Japan and life is slowly returning to a "new normal", there are still concerns about the risk of a second wave of infections if people stop taking precautions against the virus. That is why major summer festival events have been cancelled in Iwaki this year.

Although these events will unfortunately not take place this year, the details of each event are included so you can decide what festivals you would like to attend for next year. #Although the dates listed are for last year, these festivals tend to fall on the day of the week that is close to the dates listed (event dates written in bold are always held on those dates regardless of the day of week). Onahama Marine Festival	Sat 27 th - Sun 28 th Jul; Aquamarine Park, Onahama	You can ride water sleds, jet skis and other types of boats. Goldfish Hand Catching Contest	Thu 1 st Aug; Area around Yumoto Station, Joban	Children up to primary school age can try catching goldfish with their hands in a giant pool set up in front of the station for free. Onahama lwaki Odori	Fri 2 nd Aug; Kashima Highway (section between the Onahama Branch Office of Iwaki City Hall and AEON Mall Iwaki-Onahama)	Before the actual lwaki Odori, there are several perfomances including cheerleading, janagara and a taiko drum performance. lwaki Tanabata Festival	Tue 6th – Thu 8th Aug; Area around Iwaki Station, Taira	The main shopping streets of Taira will be decorated with Tanabata decorations. Iwaki Rotating Tower Bon Odori Festival	Tue 13th – Thu 15th Aug; Area around Uchigo Station	Held every year during the Obon period in Uchigo, this festival features a large rotating tower known as Kaiten Yagura that resembles Shiramizu Amida Temple. Yotsukura Repose of Souls and Revival Fireworks	Fri 16th Aug; Yotsukura Beach	Held both in order to pay tribute to the victims of the Great East Japan Earthquake and pray for the revitalisation of Yotsukura. Hula Girls "Koshien" Contest	Sun 18 th Aug; Main Theatre inside Alios and Taira Central Park (in front of Alios)	High Schools from all across Japan will compete in this annual hula dance competition.
