Notice for Permanent Residents about Extension of the Valid Period of your Residence Card

Did you know that even foreign nationals aged 16 years or older with permanent residency are required to update their Residence Card (*Zairyuu Kaado*) every 7 years (or until their 16th birthday if under 16 years old)? This also applies to those foreign nationals who have Highly Skilled Professional Type 2 status residency.

Since the new residency management system was introduced in July 2012, it is almost time for some people to begin procedures in order to update their cards. If you are a permanent resident who is 16 years or older, don't forget to confirm the date of expiration on your card as you will need to begin updating your card 2 months before the date of expiration (e.g. from May if your card's date of expiration is in July). Permanent residents under 16 years old will need to begin procedures up to 6 months before their birthday. It is highly recommended that you update your card as early as possible.

Documents required for updating your Residence Card:

- Application Form
- Photo (40x30mm)
- Passport or Certificate of Status of Residence
- Your current Residence Card

Where to apply: The Regional Immigration Bureau that your area of residence falls under the jurisdiction of (office hours are 9am-12pm and 1pm-4pm weekdays only)
