#### Samoan Rugby Team to arrive in Iwaki for training camps this Month!

The 2019 Rugby World Cup will finally kick off this month. In the lead up to the games, the Samoan National Rugby Team, also known as "Manu Samoa", will come to Iwaki to take part in pre-tournament training camps over a six-day period of  $10^{\text{th}}$ - $15^{\text{th}}$ September. This is part of the Host Town agreement signed between Iwaki and Samoa to help promote sports, cultural exchange and regional revitalisation.





Manu Samoa will be training at Iwaki Green Field and Iwaki FC Park as well as take part in several exchanges with locals. If you would like to meet the players and watch the team training, the following training session will be open to the public for one hour.

#### Iwaki-Kauai Ohana Hula Festival 2019

To celebrate Iwaki's friendship with Kauai, a Hawaiian-themed festival will be held in Alios and Spa Resort Hawaiians over three days.
