<u>"Yura-yurari" hot springs discount</u> <u>ticket campaign in Yumoto</u>



While you might want to stay indoors during the chilling winter, this time of year is also the best for dipping in a natural hot springs bath. That is why Iwaki's hot springs town is holding a discount ticket campaign throughout all of February.

After purchasing a set of 5 coupons for ¥3000 these tickets can be exchanged for free admission at hot spring facilities (1 of the 5 tickets can only be exchanged for hot springs admission), food/drink at restaurants, products and retail stores meals, or other items and discounts at other participating stores. The tickets can even be exchanged for participation in cultural workshops including kimono wearing, jangara performance, how to enter a Japanese onsen bath and more (reservations are required up to 2 days before the workshop).

Some restaurants/shops may require two tickets for the free item. Also bear in mind that not all businesses are participating in the campaign. The tickets can be purchased at Iwaki Yumoto Hot Springs Association or the Wai Wai Shop, which are both located in front of Yumoto Station. They can also be purchased from the Iwaki Town Planning Bureau (inside Horuru), several hot spring facilities and restaurants in Yumoto.

Once you have purchased the tickets, they are valid until the campaign ends on 28 February 2019. However, there are only a limited number of tickets available and they may sell out quickly.
